Great disappointment was expressed at the action of the Parish Council, and strong objection, in particular to the possible loss of the path from the Crooked Billet to the village, since it was both an ancient right of way and an intrinsic part of the heritage of Saxton. Further, to divert the path to go around the edge of the field is inconsistent with the requirement that the edges of fields are supposed to function as environmental strips for flora and fauna. The point was made that farmers advance the argument that maintenance is costly while doing little or no maintenance. The Chairman pointed out that any member of the public was free to write and express their views, and offered to email all the relevant information to enable them to do so. In conclusion, he said that it was felt that while most of the proposed changes would take place, the one which might be rejected would be the Crooked Billet one.</p> <p>Cllr.
