Approval was given to pay Selby District Council £231.84 for the dog waste bin now installed in Scarthingwell Park, £900 to the Ornate Iron Company for agreed work in the village, £261 Y.L.C.A. subscription and £36 membership subscription to the C.P.R.E.

- Y.L.C.A. Membership It was agreed to renew our membership; the subscription was £261.00.
- C.P.R.E. Membership It was agreed to renew our membership; the subscription is £36.00.
- Drainage Cllr. Ms Marshall reported that the pipes through the culvert on Main Street had now been repaired, and the Clerk was asked to write a letter of thanks to Northern Powergrid, suggesting also that, given the problems this now acknowledged obstruction had caused over the years they might consider compensating the village in some way – perhaps with regard to the needed power supply to the Cricket Club. A letter of thanks was also required to Northern Gas.
- Wild Planting around The Village Cllr. Ms Hodgson undertook this, and Mr. Bruce xxx had also volunteered.
- Trees The Clerk had instructed D.C.Tree Surgery as asked, and the work was underway.
- Grass Cutting Contract Having been advised that the previous contractors were no longer available, the Clerk had made contact with two further companies, only one of which had taken the matter forward. She had walked with the village with Charles Dunford, and agreed that his firm would do the initial cut, after which he would be better able to quote a price per cut.
- Such other business as, in the opinion of the Chairman, should, by means of special circumstances, be considered as a matter of urgency Flood plan – Cllr. Mr. Dennison had not yet advised whether he would be willing to assume responsibility for emergencies; the Clerk advised that in the absence of a volunteer the responsibility would devolve upon the office of the Clerk.
- Cllr. Mr, Wilson enquired whether there had been any progress over the Cricket Club's request for a loan, and the Clerk confirmed there had not. Out of courtesy, she had made contact with Cllr. Mr. Dennison.
- There was a request for an extra street light in the vicinity of the crossroads; Cllr. Ms Hodgson would look into the matter and report to the next meeting:
