<u>Apologies for Absence</u>	None had been received	
<u>Minutes of the Previous Meeting</u>	These were signed as a true record.	
<u>Public Forum</u>	No member of the public asked to speak.	
<u>Matters Arising from the Minutes</u>	<p>20mph hour speed limit – in view of the attendance of Sharon Fox, the Chairman decided to deal with the matter at this point. It was decided that a VAS (Vehicle Activated Signage) was required; the scheme records speed data, and requires two volunteers at any one time. The cost of a temporary VAS is £1000, that of a permanent installation £12000, and the PC at the present time chose a temporary installation. Ms Fox would pursue the matter on the PC's behalf, and advise. In addition the Clerk was instructed to follow up with Constable Andrew Shipley the question of Community Speed Watch.</p> <p>Questions to, and response from, Chair of Board of school Governors – this was tabled for the next meeting</p> <p>School bin store – the Chairman of the Board of School Governors explained the problem for the benefit of those not present earlier. It was resolved that he would speak further with the District Council, also to the diocese via the Parochial Church Council. Andrew Lee would add his support.</p> <p>Update on Complaints Committee – the hearing had not yet been held due to the YLCA's tardiness in supplying required information.</p> <p>Provision of waste bin in B.1217 lay-by – it was agreed to provide a wheelie bin, in a housing, at a cost of £459 plus V.A.T.</p> <p>Scarecrow festival – an upfront budget of £100 was agreed</p> <p>Correspondence with Queen Ethelberga's school – a further request had been received that the Parish Council withdraw its objection to the route. This was vetoed, but the Clerk was asked to acknowledge the letter received from the school and to ask that their driver observe due consideration.</p> <p>Grass cutting – the Parish Council was awaiting a response from neighbouring councils over a group contract and consequential favourable price.</p>	
<u>Drainage</u>	The Clerk and Cllr. Ms Marshall had attended the meeting in this regard and John Hodgson from Highways had identified the way forward, though he had not yet contacted the Clerk again with dates as promised. Andrew Lee would chase.
