#### Public Forum

Complaint was made over the wheelie bins left in Dam Lane by the school. The Chair explained the situation, that the school insisted on having really large bins, which could not be handled by the cleaner and which the contractors emptying them refused to collect from or return to the school premises. The Clerk advised that she had in the past been contacted by the school secretary and had enquired over planning permission on the school's behalf for a permanent built bin store by the school gate, but that the school had then not taken the matter further. Given that North Yorkshire County Council has ultimate responsibility for schools in the area, Andrew Lee would look into the matter on our behalf.

At the previous meeting, the question had been asked whether there was a footpath crossing the fields behind the north side of Saxton Lane, and it was confirmed that the line shown on the map produced was a contour line.
