

been given for 500 new residential properties in Sherburn, which would impact on the traffic through Saxton. The Clerk was instructed to ask for LOCAL TRAFFIC ONLY signs, also to remind Glen Donaldson of Highways of his promise not to divert traffic through Saxton when Sir John's Lane is again closed for roadworks.

To receive Cllr. Mrs Richardson's report on progress over Community Speedwatch – there had been a well-attended training meeting, and three sites approved in the village:- the bottom of Manor Drive, outside Pear Tree Farm and outside Larchfield .

To receive Cllr. Ms Marshall's report on footpaths/grass verges – despite the undertaking that all interested parties would be consulted on the Order, neither Ms Marshall nor the Parish council had received any contact in this regard; Ms Marshall would follow up the matter. The Chair had no objection to diversions as such, on condition that a circular perimeter walk was retained. Ms Marshall reported a response from Andrew Hunter (Diversion Officer, NYCC) re signing and the actual position of the new paths (within the field boundaries not in the highway area including verges and dykes). It was resolved that Andrew Hunter be contacted to walk the proposed new paths with members of the Parish Council so that we are all certain where they are to be.

Extra item – it was reported that someone has damaged the grass on the village green, and it was established that any villager has the right to remonstrate with a non-resident seen to be misusing the village green in any way.

A "Mendip" supplied by Whitehill Direct Limited was chosen, and the Clerk was instructed to advise Richard Musgrave, requesting that any recompense from the long standing council tax mistake be put towards this cost

In Mr Westmoreland's absence, he had advised that there was progress in connecting the 2 No. lights on/close to Saxton Lane; the work is still to complete but the groundwork has begun and the second fitting is now in place.

Noise level from the motorway has increased tremendously, and the Clerk was instructed to contact the Highways Agency in this connection.

It was agreed to renew the Parish Council's membership; the subscription is £36

No members of the general public were present.

- a. Proposed demolition of existing bungalow and outbuildings and erection of 2 No. detached dwellings – it was understood that a revised plan either had already been or soon would be submitted, and Clerk was instructed to request further details with regard to this. Also to advise that in its current form the PC would object to it on the grounds that both dwellings are too close to the neighbouring properties, and so detract from the neighbours' enjoyment of their properties.
- b. The Old Stables, Wakefield Road, Saxton – the Clerk had been further advised by the Case Officer at Selby that the extension of time was ongoing.
